Help Students Become Information Savvy

Instruction sessions work best when:

- ☐ Students have an assignment that requires them to use the library and they receive it prior to their scheduled library workshop.
- ☐ Instructors test the assignment to be sure that it is workable and that the resources needed to complete it are available.
- ☐ The librarian and instructor design workshops to address immediate information needs.
- ☐ Librarians have time to think about the learning outcomes and plan an appropriate workshop.
- ☐ Students sense their instructor's enthusiasm.

research databases

ABI/INFORM Trade & Industry Citations and full-text articles from publications aimed at specific industries.

Academic Search Complete Multi-disciplinary database with scholarly and peer reviewed journals and magazines covering almost all academic disciplines. Full text for many articles.

Access Science *McGraw-Hill Encyclopedia of Science & Technology* includes scientific definitions, biographies, science and technology developments, and daily updates.

Alt-Press Watch Full-text collection of newspapers, magazines, and journals from the alternative and independent press.

Britannica Online Authoritative encyclopedia with articles at multiple reading levels. Includes web links selected & reviewed by Britannica editors.

CQ Researcher In-depth, non-biased coverage of political and social issues, with regular reports on national and international topics.

Credo Reference Full-text collection of articles from 100+ encyclopedias and dictionaries, from some of the world's best reference publishers.

CultureGrams Online Country reports on 182 cultures of the world.

eLibrary Academic Articles from magazines, newspapers, and reference books; multimedia from radio and TV transcripts. Benefits multiple research skill levels.

ERIC Education database includes journal article citations and full text documents.

Ethnic NewsWatch Collection of full-text articles from the ethnic, minority and native press.

Global Road Warrior International resource for social, cultural, travel, and business information.

Health & Wellness Resource Up-to-date articles from a wide variety of authoritative medical sources - includes alternative health sources.

Health Reference Center Academic Full-text articles from nursing and allied health journals.

History Resource Center Essays, full-text journal articles, biographies and primary source documents from pre-Colonial times to the present.

Literature Resource Center Literature database of modern authors, poets and playwrights. Includes academic journal articles, biographical information, interviews, critical essays.

New York Times Historical Full page and article images with searchable full-text of articles. [1851-2006]

Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center Current events topics with pro/con argumentative essays, overviews, statistics, primary documents, website links, and full-text periodical articles.

ProQuest Newspapers Full text of 300+ U.S. and international news sources such as *The New York Times* and the *Times of London*.

ProQuest Research Library Multidisciplinary database of articles from scholarly and general interest magazines, journals and newspapers covering a wide range of topics.

PubMed MEDLINE citations and additional life science journals. Links to many sites providing full text articles and other related resources.

SocINDEX Comprehensive sociology database of journal articles and conference proceedings covering criminal justice, marriage & family, social work, addictions, violence, and more.

TOPICsearch Current events, social, political and economic issues, and scientific discoveries. Sources include opinion polls, pamphlets, and government documents.

Testing & Education Reference Center Preparatory entrance tests (GED, TOEFL, and more), plus information on colleges, available scholarships and awards.

WOIS Career Info Job descriptions for more than 340 occupations, as well as information on training programs and schools in Washington state. ** Available only in the library or on campus.
